Discussion Guide

The Scoop

Prayer is kind of like preparing for a marathon. You need to start long before you need it in order to reap its full benefits.

Key Verse

Matthew 26:36 (MSG)

Then Jesus went with his disciples to a place called Gethsemane, and he said to them, "Sit here while I go over there and pray."

Discussion

If you are preparing for a marathon, typically you don't start within a few weeks of race. You prepare long before so you are ready when the race happens. It takes consistent effort over a long period of time to prepare for something of this nature.

- 1. Can you think of any other examples of things that take investment over time to achieve the results you wish to achieve?
- 2. Have you ever tried to do something last minute that really should have taken a longer time to prepare?

Our prayer lives often resemble a last minute attempt at solving an immediate problem that we could have been better equipped to handle had we been in prayer over the course of time. In Matthew 26:36-39, Jesus prays to God about his impending death. The argument here is that Jesus was able to handle everything he endured as a result of regular prayer and preparation long before he needed the strength.

- 3. Can you think of a time in your life when you prayed last minute for something for which you were not prepared?
- 4. What difficult things have you faced that faith helped you navigate or maybe a lack of engagement with God made it difficult to navigate?

Boxer Joe Frasier said the following regarding preparation, "You can map out a fight plan or a life plan, but when the action starts, it may not go the way you planned, and you're down to your reflexes - that means your [preparation:]. That's where your roadwork shows. If you cheated on that in the dark of the morning, well, you're going to get found out now, under the bright lights."

- 5. What do you think equates to "roadwork" when it comes to faith and relationship with God?
- 6. What would you change about your prayer life to engage God more regularly in preparation for navigating the tough things life throws at us?
