Key Verse

Luke 14:28 (NLT)

But don't begin until you count the cost. For who would begin construction of a building without first calculating the cost to see if there is enough money to finish it? Otherwise, you might complete only the foundation before running out of money, and then everyone would laugh at you. They would say, 'There's the person who started that building and couldn't afford to finish it!'

Discussion

60% of New Year's resolutions fail within 6 months. The first step to a successful year is dreaming about what is most important to you. Jesus says before following him on should consider or "count the cost." The key to success in your next year is knowing why. Why is it important to you? How does it improve your life?

- 1. What is an example of a resolution you have started that failed or faded? Why do you think that is?
- 2. What are 2-3 goals you would like to achieve in the next year? Why?

If we stop long enough to plan, making sure we have the right ingredients, we can determine if the goal is worth it to us and we can set a plan for accomplishing it and seeing it through. This way the plans build toward the end goal rather than a make or break scenario.

- 4. What are the obstacles you will face in achieving these goals?

Now that you have attached the importance to the goal and have some steps set in the direction of accomplishing the goal consider bringing God along for the ride. God delights in the successes of his kids. The ultimate honor in having the best year ever is aligning our goals with God's.
